

Return to the Moon: How Artemis II marks the start of a new space age



NASA's Artemis II SLS (Space Launch System) rocket and Orion spacecraft are all set for launch from the agency's Kennedy Space Center in Florida. The US is all set to push the boundaries of space exploration, science, and technology once again, as America is on the verge of exploring more of the Moon than ever before.

This new era of lunar exploration programme, called Artemis, is named after the twin sister of Apollo; she is the Goddess of the Moon. NASA is all set to put humans on the Moon again after over half a century. The world is technologically much more advanced. Private industry is now deeply involved in exploring space, including tourism.

Artemis I was an uncrewed flight test of the SLS and the Orion spacecraft around the Moon. Artemis II will be the first crewed flight test of the SLS and the Orion spacecraft around the Moon. This test flight will send four astronauts on a more than 950,000 kilometre, 10-day journey around the Moon (a lunar flyby) to test critical spacecraft systems ahead of Artemis III, which aims to someday land astronauts near the Moon's South Pole, a region never explored by humans. Artemis IV debuts humanity's first lunar space station, launched by a larger, more powerful version of the SLS rocket and the new mobile launcher.

Artemis II is testing the critical systems needed for a future lunar landing, much as the early Apollo missions prepared NASA to land humans on the Moon. There were three launch windows spread across February, March, and April. 01 April is the final choice for NASA to send the rocket, spacecraft, and crew to the Moon.

The Plan to Return to the Moon Unfolds

The earlier plan was to send robots to the Moon starting in 2021 and astronauts in 2024, and to build a long-term presence on the Moon by 2030. Then the Moon was to be used as the stepping stone for human exploration of Mars. There was to be an orbiting Gateway space station, lunar landers (SpaceX Starship, Blue Origin Blue Moon), and scientific research, with a long-term goal of regular lunar landings and deeper space exploration.

Finally, Artemis I, an uncrewed Moon-orbiting mission, was launched in November 2022. It was the first integrated flight test of the Orion spacecraft and SLS rocket, and its main objective was to test the Orion spacecraft, especially its heat shield, in preparation for subsequent Artemis missions.

The Apollo Programme

The Apollo programme was the United States human spaceflight programme led by NASA, which landed the first humans on the Moon in 1969. It was conceived in 1960 as a three-person spacecraft during the presidency of Dwight D. Eisenhower. Apollo was later dedicated to President John F. Kennedy's national goal for the 1960s of "landing a man on the Moon and returning him safely to the Earth" in an address to the US Congress on 25 May 1961.

Apollo 11 was launched by a Saturn V rocket from Kennedy Space Center on Merritt Island, Florida, on 16 July, and it was the fifth crewed mission of NASA's Apollo programme. Kennedy's goal was accomplished on 20 July 1969, when Commander Neil Armstrong and lunar module pilot Buzz Aldrin formed the American crew that landed the Apollo Lunar Module "Eagle".

Water problem in East Sta. Chairman-Dandak area

Rajkot, Political parties are making all-out efforts for the upcoming elections to be held on April 26. At that time, Divya Bhaskar's team is meeting people in different wards of the city to know the mood of the people. Under this, today Divya Bhaskar reached areas including Race Course Park, Airport Road, Bhomeshwar and Bajrangwadi in Ward No. 2 of Rajkot.

In which, while talking to the people, it was revealed that the people of this area have problems including drinking water, sanitation and drainage. In addition to the streets and lanes of this area, heaps of garbage including construction waste were seen on the main road connecting Jamnagar Road. So, since the work of Sandhiya bridge is going on, it was seen that people have to face a lot of trouble when the gate is closed. Almost no one knows the names of the four corporators and when elections come, the leaders come to ask for votes, but then do not even come to listen to the problems. People said this.

'Water from Vokla enters people's homes'

Hasmukhbhai Sorathiya, who has been doing business near the airport gate for 30 years, told Divya Bhaskar that the main problem is the flooding of Vokla near the airport gate. During the monsoon, water from Vokla enters people's homes, due to which people have to suffer a lot. Despite making representations on this issue several times, no solution has been found yet. Road and cleaning work is being done well, but we demand that this problem of flooding be permanently resolved.

'Everyone comes to seek votes, then no one is seen for five years'

A woman named Sunitaben Parmar, who lives in Bhomeshwa, said that there are many problems here, especially with the roads. There is so much garbage here, everyone goes here after cleaning. If we tell anyone, no one believes us. No matter how many times we clean it, they still come here and throw garbage. We have also complained about the sewerage, but no one comes

to clean the sewerage. We do not know the corporator. Everyone comes to seek votes, but then no one is seen for five years. 'The water in the tap is dirty and muddy'

He further said that this problem is permanent here. This is the kundi which we have complained about for 15 days, but they keep looking and leaving empty, no one cleans it. Water comes in the tap but it comes dirty and muddy. Clean water does not come. Our corporation has only one demand that all this be cleaned, give clean water and get the drains cleaned. If we complain, then solve it, that's all there is to it.

Epidemic due to water holes filled in many places

has created a serious problem of drinking water in Bajrangwadi-12 area of ??Rajkot. There have been complaints of extremely dirty and polluted water coming from this area for a long time. Many locals including Hetalben and her husband have fallen ill due to this contaminated water. 2 cases of diarrhea and vomiting and many cases of stomach pain have been reported in this area. Apart from this, there is a fear of an outbreak of epidemic due to water holes filled in many places. Local resident Hetalben expressed his anger over the health of the people being put at risk due to dirty water and said that the health of the people of the area is being put at risk due to dirty water. Despite making several representations, no corporator has come to visit the area to solve this serious problem or to know the condition of the people. There is a demand that the system should take appropriate action immediately. We have never seen the corporators. They come only to take votes, then no one is seen. 'There is a serious problem of dirt and water every day' Sharadben Chavda, a resident of Maruti Nagar, expressed her anger before Divya Bhaskar about the basic facilities of this area and said, "There is a serious problem of dirt and water in our area forever. Water comes in the tap for only 10 to 15 minutes and that too with very slow force. In this time, only 10 to 15 buckets of water are filled, which is not enough in

the summer season." 'Despite making representations, no solution has been found till date' He further said that heaps of garbage are seen everywhere, for which no arrangements are made for its disposal. Despite making written and verbal representations to the water department and the corporator several times in this regard, no solution has been found till date. We pay taxes regularly and also go to vote during elections, but there is zero in the name of convenience. The corporator appears only during elections and does not give any response at present.

'No one comes to clean our area'

A local woman named Dayaben, who lives in Bajrangwadi, told Divya Bhaskar that the drinking water in her area is extremely turbid and dirty. Since there is no RO system in the house, we have to boil water and drink it, yet people are falling

sick. There have been complaints that diseases like diarrhea and stomach ache are spreading due to dirty water.

Regarding cleaning, Dayaben said, "No employee comes to our area regularly to clean. Cleaning work is done only when requested by the locals, otherwise the piles of dirt remain piled up."

'They dump garbage on the roads'

Kunjali Jagda, a resident of Race Course Park in Ward No. 2 of Rajkot, expressed his anger over various problems in the area. In a conversation with Divya Bhaskar, he said that instead of cleaning the block, the sanitation workers in the area only dump garbage on the roads. Despite repeated representations to the workers in this regard, no satisfactory response is given by the administration.

Apart from this, residents are facing noise problem due to continuous use of

loudspeakers by hawkers in their area. According to Kunjalben, hawkers keep the loudspeakers on continuously at high volume, which needs to be stopped. Corporators appear only during elections to seek votes, but after that they show no interest in listening to the issues of the area let alone solving them.

'They are pushing from one number to another'

Residents of Sanjaynagar area in Ward No. 2 of Rajkot have been facing a serious problem of polluted water for a long time. Bhavanaben alleged that when we call to complain, they are pushed from one number to another, but no one comes to the spot and brings a solution. And even the leaders who come to seek votes during elections do not show up after winning, due to which there is a lot of anger among the locals. Then the residents demand that arrangements for clean water be made at the earliest.

'Sewer water has been overflowing for 12 days'

A serious problem of overflowing sewer has arisen in Sanjaynagar on Jamnagar Road in Rajkot. Expressing her anger over this, local woman Hanifa Ben said that sewer water has been overflowing for the last 12 days, due to which we are facing a lot of trouble. The sewage has increased so much that it is as if the entire hawkers is overflowing. We have made written and verbal complaints to the administration several times in this regard, but there has been no result.

'We don't even know the corporator of our area'

he added, adding that earlier Congress workers had also come and taken pictures, but till date no one has come to clean it. Expressing anger against the leaders who come to seek votes during elections, he said that when it is time to take votes, leaders come door to door, but after winning.
