Can India Inc Stay the Course Credit Quality Assessment for H2FY26



Ahmedabad, According to CareEdge Ratings Credit Ratio, which measures the proportion of rating upgrades to downgrades, stood at 1.93 times in the second half of fiscal 2026, lower than 2.56 times observed in the first half. During this period, 363 entities were upgraded and 188 were downgraded. While the credit ratio remains above the 10-year average of 1.55, the moderation suggests early signs of stress amid a more challenging environment. The downgrade rate, at 7%, remains below the long-term average of 10%; however, the moderation in upgrades, from the long-term average of 15% to 13% in the current period, suggests that improvement in credit profiles is becoming

more selective. Nevertheless, reaffirmations remained high at 80%, indicating that the bulk of the rated universe continues to hold its ground even as the external environment grows more complex. Sachin Gupta, Executive Director and Chief Rating Officer, CareEdge Ratings, commented on the evolving economic landscape, stating, "The escalation of the West Asia conflict has added a new and potent layer of uncertainty. Given India's high dependence on energy imports, a prolonged conflict situation could have cascading effects — fuelling inflation, widening the current account deficit, exerting pressure on fiscal balances, and weighing on growth. Drones, denial, and the Northeast: Matthew VanDyke and India's emerging security blind spot

The arrest of American national Matthew VanDyke by India's National Investigation Agency (NIA), alongside several Ukrainian nationals, has triggered a wave of speculation that risks outrunning the facts. Yet, this is not a case that can be dismissed as routine. The timing alone places it within a far more consequential shift: the quiet arrival of drone warfare into the insurgent ecosystems bordering India's Northeast. The question is not whether these events are directly connected. It is whether they belong to the same emerging pattern — and whether India is prepared to recognise it before it hardens into reality. Drone attacks in February may come to be seen as the inflection point. Reports from Myanmar describe the use of first-person-view "suicide drones" in Kachin State, including an attack on infrastructure at Myitkyina Airport. The Kachin Independence Army (KIA) has denied responsibility, particularly where civilian

targets are concerned, and the fog of Myanmar's information war makes definitive attribution difficult. But that is not the most important detail. What matters is that the capability now exists. Drone warfare — once confined to state militaries and major theatres — is no longer external to this conflict. It has entered it. And once introduced into an environment as porous and networked as northern Myanmar, it does not remain contained for long.

The KIA has historically demonstrated a capacity for adaptation, but this represents something more than incremental change. Low-cost, highly manoeuvrable systems, particularly FPV drones, offer insurgent groups the ability to strike with precision, disrupt infrastructure, and alter psychological dynamics at minimal cost. It is a model refined elsewhere, most notably in Ukraine, where innovation has outpaced doctrine.

It is here that the arrests in India begin to take on greater significance.

Sons of Liberty International, the organisation associated with VanDyke, operates in precisely the kind of grey zones where training, advisory roles, and non-state military support intersect. My sources confirm that SOLI has been working with Kachin and KIA sympathisers in the United States — an important distinction that places its activities within a broader ecosystem of advocacy, engagement, and proximity to the conflict, rather than direct battlefield alignment. At the same time, Ukrainian nationals — emerging from the most advanced drone warfare environment in the world — have been detained alongside him. This convergence is difficult to ignore, but it must be interpreted carefully.

There is, at present, no confirmed evidence that SOLI transferred drone technology to the KIA, nor that Ukrainian expertise has been operationalised within Myanmar's insurgent landscape. Still less is there proof that such capabilities have crossed into India. But the absence of proof is not the absence of risk. What exists is a set of overlapping conditions in which knowledge, techniques, and tactical innovation can move — informally, incrementally, and often invisibly. And this is where the nature of the actors involved becomes relevant.

Matthew VanDyke is not a figure operating in the shadows in the conventional sense. On the contrary, he is something of an OSINT analyst's dream. His movements, affiliations, and activities have often been visible, documented, and, at times, self-curated. This is not the profile of a disciplined covert operative or a tightly controlled mercenary asset. It is the profile of an individual operating in the blurred space between activism, advisory work, and conflict participation — where visibility and deniability coexist uneasily.

That visibility cuts both ways. It complicates any attempt to construct a narrative of covert state-backed transfer, but it also underscores how porous these environments have become. Influence and expertise no longer move exclusively through clandestine channels. They move through networks — messy, decentralised and often hiding in plain sight. America did build up private intelligence networks during the Cold War and the US-led Global War on Terrorism. Plausible deniability or an
