

India emerges as global leader in "disaster warning": Jitendra Singh

(contd ... page 1) Reflecting on the catastrophic tsunami that claimed over 230,000 lives worldwide, including 10,749 in India, Dr Jitendra Singh remarked on the invaluable lessons learned and the transformative policies that followed. “The tragedy served as a catalyst for establishing institutions like INCOIS, which now stands as a testament to India’s commitment to safeguarding lives and livelihoods,” he said. India’s Tsunami Early Warning System, lauded internationally, was showcased as a cornerstone of the nation’s disaster preparedness. The Minister also noted ongoing collaborations with UNESCO and the Tsunami Ready Initiative, which aims to bolster community resilience across vulnerable regions. He cited the recognition of 24 Indian communities under this program as evidence of a community-centric approach. Dr Jitendra Singh underlined the growing significance of oceanic exploration in India’s journey toward becoming "Viksit Bharat". With a 7,500-km coastline and abundant marine resources, he advocated for their sustainable exploration and conservation. “Our deep-sea mission and initiatives like BioE3 [Biotechnology for Environment, Employment, and Economy] are creating an ecosystem that will not only enhance biodiversity but also contribute to national prosperity,” he said. Looking ahead, the Minister expressed optimism about concurrent breakthroughs in space and marine missions, envisioning an India that leads globally in both realms. “We are planning to deploy an Indian in the deep sea and another in space, possibly by 2026, marking a historic milestone,” he announced. His remarks also celebrated the synergy between policy and science, attributing the rapid advancements in sectors like space and oceanography to the government’s proactive support. Dr Jitendra Singh also highlighted India’s proactive role in international collaboration through INCOIS, which hosts a UNESCO Category 2 Training Centre. This centre acts as a hub for capacity building and knowledge sharing on ocean-based disaster management. He noted INCOIS’s active involvement in the Ocean Decade Tsunami Programme, which aims to achieve 100% tsunami-ready communities globally by 2030. “Through initiatives like these, we are not only strengthening global partnerships but also paving the way for resilient coastal communities worldwide,” he remarked. Additionally, the Minister underscored the need to integrate tsunami warnings with other ocean-related hazards, such as storm surges and high waves, into a comprehensive multi-hazard early warning system. He emphasized that such advancements would sustain India’s tsunami warning capabilities while addressing the growing complexity of oceanic risks. “This forward-looking approach will ensure that we continue to safeguard lives and livelihoods against a wide spectrum of potential disasters,” he added. The Minister reiterated INCOIS’s integral role in India’s Vision 2047. “By exploring untapped resources and ensuring disaster readiness, INCOIS is a vital contributor to building a self-reliant and resilient India,” he affirmed. The event, attended by Dr M. Ravi Chandran, Secretary, Ministry of Earth Sciences, and eminent scientists and policymakers, served as a platform to celebrate two decades of achievements while charting a path forward for holistic and sustainable development.

EEPC India submits pre-Budget proposals to FM Sitharaman

Enhancing the total MAI fund allocation to Rs 1,200 crores would support MSMEs in participating in international trade events and connect with their global counterparts. "Allocating specific funds for capacity-building programs targeting prospective exporters in interior districts and rural areas would enable them to enter international markets," said EEPC India Chairman Pankaj Chadha. In order to support MSMEs in transitioning to sustainable energy practices, EEPC India has also proposed to introduce a policy allowing 100% depreciation on investments in solar power generation by MSMEs, similar to previous benefits provided for wind power generation. This would incentivize MSMEs to reduce their carbon footprint and lower energy costs. Among other proposals, EEPC India has recommended to establish a transparent and effective mechanism to ensure MSMEs access steel at affordable price, balancing the interests of both producers and users. "The introduction of a safeguard duty on certain steel imports may increase the landed cost of steel, leading to higher domestic prices. For MSMEs, steel constitutes 60% of their production costs, making them vulnerable to global competition and potential job losses. While steel producers have agreed to supply steel at export parity prices, MSMEs often purchase from intermediaries like agents or distributors," Chadha said. EEPC India has also recommended to increase the cap under Interest Equalization Scheme (IES) to Rs 10 crores to provide more substantial financial support to MSME exporters, aligning with the previous limits and the growing needs of the exporting community.

The high court came up for hearing today on a petition filed by group-1 candidates. In the High Court too, the candidates have been cheated. The high court has dismissed the petition of the candidates to stop the results of the examination. With the high court verdict, the group-I results have been removed. Earlier, the candidates had filed a petition in the single bench of the high court seeking cancellation of the Group-I Mains examinations. The petition was dismissed by a single bench. Within two days, the candidates filed a petition in the division bench challenging the single bench's verdict. The division bench also dismissed the petition filed by the candidates seeking postponement of the Group-I exams. The division bench agreed with the verdict of the single bench. With this, the Telangana government conducted the exams as the hurdles for the Group-I exams were removed. The exams were held peacefully from October 21 to 27 this year. The candidates again approached the high court seeking a stay on the results of the Group-I exams till the reservation is decided. There, too, they were disappointed. The high court today dismissed the petition filed by the candidates.

(contd ... page 1) Mentored by Dr B Dinesh Kumar, former Scientist G and Head of Drug Division, during the development of the non-hormonal Ayurveda therapy, Dr Vandana says her research involved plant species identification, quality standards, proof of concept, regulatory compliance and prototype formulation. “This non-hormonal, safe and effective solution aims to enhance the quality of life of menopausal women. The work has already been recognized globally, including a shortlist for the Alice and Albert Netter prize 2023 by European Society of Gynecology. The study has already been published in scientific journals and acknowledged by peer review groups and professional societies,” she says. Dr Vandana points out that the non-hormonal therapy also paves the way for future advancements in women’s health research in Ayurveda.
