

No party other than Congress has truly thought about farmers: Bhatti

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He further noted that in just three months since coming to power, the Congress government has already waived Rs.21,000 crores in farm loans—an act unmatched by any other government in the country. He added that the government is also providing Rs.12,000 annually to landless and poor agricultural laborers directly into their bank accounts.

The Deputy Chief Minister accused the previous BRS government of merely offering token amounts under “Rythu Bandhu” while

stopping zero-interest and low-interest loans, subsidies for drip and sprinkler systems, bonuses for harvested crops, MSP payments, and compensation for crop loss.

He emphasised that the Congress government, upon taking office, not only waived farm loans and provided Rythu Bharosa funds, but also distributed drip and sprinkler systems, offered compensation for crop losses, and is now distributing modern agricultural machinery. They alleged that the TRS rulers who ruled this state for 10

years deposited meager funds in the name of Rythu Bandhu and stopped interest-free loans, interest-only loans, drip irrigation, sprinklers, support price, bonus for harvested crops, and crop loss compensation.

He said that when the Congress government came to power, it waived off farmer loans, provided farmers with insurance, provided drip irrigation and sprinklers, provided compensation in case of crop damage, and distributed modern machinery to farmers. No other government in this state has pro-

vided all the necessary facilities for farmers except the Congress government, and no other government will do so.

On the 16th of this month, CM Revanth Reddy announced at the Agriculture University that he would deposit Rs 9,000 crore under Rythu Bharosa in nine days and hold a large-scale festival on the 24th of this month. We have kept our word, as he said. The Deputy CM asked for blessings from the Congress government, which is responsible for the farmers' festival.

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He remarked that the 18 months of Congress leadership represent a significant period for Telangana and emphasized the importance of the party and government working in harmony. Revanth Reddy advised that party committees should be established at the booth, village, and mandal

levels. He noted that a robust presence at the booth level would enable government initiatives to be efficiently delivered to the people. He also urged the TPCC to concentrate on reinforcing the party's structure and called for party leaders to unite their efforts in order to facilitate the Congress's return to power.

The Chief Minister has directed party committee leaders to engage at the grassroots level and set specific objectives, emphasising the need to fill nominated positions such as those in market and temple committees. "We will encounter numerous challenges in the near future. Matters such as delimitation,

the women's reservation bill, and Jamili elections are all on the horizon. Given these circumstances, I am prepared to visit villages and raise awareness among the people. Party leaders must be ready to face these challenges, and they should also prepare for the upcoming Jubilee Hills by-election," stated Revanth Reddy.

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The Minister further noted that Telangana is integrating Artificial Intelligence into its TG-iPASS industrial approval system to enhance transparency and speed in clearances. KCR has one in Gajwel? They accumulated immense wealth, yet the state of Telangana is burdened with a debt of Rs. 8 lakh crores. Over the past decade, KCR's family has become wealthier than the Nizams, while the once-prosperous state of Telangana is now facing bankruptcy," he emphasized.

Harish Rao asks govt to stop dramas for gaining local body elections

Security forces role in defeating Naxalism will be etched in golden letters: Shah

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Addressing the security personnel, Shah paid tribute to the courage, valour, sacrifice, and dedication of the Central Armed Police Forces, the CoBRA teams, Chhattisgarh Police, and the District Reserve Guard (DRG), a Home Ministry statement said.

He said, "I have full faith that it is the bravery and tireless efforts of our security forces that make the battle against Naxalism a success."

Shah said that security forces worldwide have been astonished by the way security forces have dismantled Maoist hideouts with immense courage, patience, and commitment.

"I know that what our jawans set out to achieve,

they always accomplish," he added. He further asserted, "It is the trust in our security forces inspired by which I keep reiterating that we will eradicate Naxalism before the 31st of March 2026."

Shah said Naxalism has been a major catastrophe for poor tribal regions, leading to the deaths of nearly 40,000 people over the last 35 years, while many more have been left disabled. He said that Naxal violence deprived the poor tribal population of basic necessities such as food, electricity, education, housing, toilets, and clean drinking water—let alone any possibility of industrial development. Entire regions were forced to live in conditions akin to slavery for decades, and the

root cause of this suffering was Naxalism.

The Home Minister expressed satisfaction that, as Naxalism is being eliminated from various regions, the Chhattisgarh government is ensuring the delivery of food, healthcare, education, electricity, housing, sanitation, and clean drinking water—thereby connecting people with the mainstream of development.

“When a child picks up a pencil instead of a gun and begins writing 'Ka, Kha, Ga', it doesn't just change the future of that child, but of the entire nation. That moment is very close,” Shah said.

He further stated that when the country becomes free from Naxalism in March 2026, it will be one of the

most significant moments since Independence. He said that when the history of the eradication of Naxalism is written, the sacrifice, devotion, and hard work of our security forces will be inscribed in golden letters.

The Home Minister also released the book ‘Leor Oyna’ on the occasion. The book is based on the lives of victims of Naxal violence. It will help in understanding the pain of those innocent and unarmed people who fell prey to the ruthless violence inflicted by Naxalites. It will also open the eyes of those who show sympathy towards Naxalites in the name of human rights and will be instrumental in exposing them.

Rajnath Singh to push anti-terror agenda at SCO meet in China

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India attaches special importance to SCO in promoting multilateralism, political, security, economic and people-to-people interactions in the region. SCO pursues its policy based on the principles of sovereignty, territorial integrity of nations, non-interference in internal affairs, mutual respect, understanding and equality of all member-states. SCO is an inter-governmental organisation established in 2001. India became a full member in 2017 and assumed the rotating Chairmanship in 2023.

The SCO membership includes Kazakhstan, China, Kyrgyzstan, Pakistan, Russia, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan, Iran and Belarus, besides India. China has assumed the Chair of the SCO for 2025 under the theme 'Upholding the Shanghai Spirit: SCO on the Move'.

In addition to addressing the plenary, Singh will hold bilateral meetings with his counterparts from several participating nations, including China and Russia. "India attaches special importance to SCO in promoting multilateralism, political,

security, economic and people-to-people interactions in the region. SCO pursues its policy based on the principles of sovereignty, territorial integrity of nations, non-interference in internal affairs, mutual respect, understanding and equality of all member states," the Ministry of Defence said. China is hosting the conclave as the current chair of the SCO. Relations between India and China have remained tense since the violent Galwan Valley clash in June 2020, though recent diplomatic engagements have aimed

at thawing ties. The military standoff officially ended following the completion of disengagement at Demchok and Depsang in October last year. NSA Doval's Beijing visit in December and his discussions with Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi under the Special Representatives (SR) framework marked a key step in reviving dialogue. The decision to reactivate the SR mechanism was reached during a meeting between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chinese President Xi Jinping in Kazan on October 23.
