

Kolkata Gangrape Case: SIT Expanded To 9 Members

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The incident that comes 10 months after the RG Kar hos-pital rape and murder case has triggered a political row in West Bengal. Congress and the BJP earlier in the day held separate protests over the incident. Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) launched an all-out attack on the ruling Trinamool Congress in West Bengal over the alleged gangrape incident, with the party demanding the resignation of the Chief Minister, Mamata Banerjee. BJP leader Gaurav Vallabh attacked the TMC government led by Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee and said that the government which fails to protect its women should be dismissed. BJP leader Gourav Vallabh told, "I strongly demand that a government that fails to protect its women must be dismissed. It is disgrace-ful to see MPs standing with the accused, claiming it was a matter of friendship

or asking 'what should we do.' Such behaviour from TMC leaders, who are try-ing to shield the accused, is shameful... Mamata Banerjee should resign im-mediately." Vallabh also questioned the relationship between the gangrape accused and the TMC. "What is the relationship between the gang rape accused and the TMC? Why do accused often emerge as members of the TMC party? In this case, the accused is also found to be a member of TMC. All of this is happening when the West Bengal Chief Minister is a woman... I believe Bengal has now become synonymous with anarchy, corruption, and nepotism," he said. Police have arrested three people identified as Manojit Mishra, Zaib Ahmed and Pramit Mukhopadhyay for their alleged involvement in the

Kolkata Law College gangrape case. The ac-cused have been remanded to police custody till July 1. Additionally, police are also investigating the Guard of the Law College, Pinaki Banerjee's role in the alleged offence. Kolkata Police Chief Prosecutor Sourin Ghosal told, "We are investigating his (Guard of the Law College, Pinaki Banerjee) role in the alleged offence...The court has granted his police cus-tody till July 1." The BJP has set up a four-member fact-finding committee to investigate the case. BJP MP Sambit Patra an-nounced while addressing a press conference in the National Capital on Satur-day. "BJP President JP Nadda has formed a com-mittee, and that committee will visit the spot and in-vestigate. Its members are former Union Ministers Satpal Singh, Meenakshi Lekhi and MPs Biplab Deb

and Manan Mishra. This committee will soon visit the spot and submit its re-port to the National Presi-dent," he said. Patra de-manded that Mamata Banerjee apologise and re-sign as the Chief Minister. "We are not asking for clarification from Mamata Banerjee. We are asking her to apologise and re-sign," Patra said. Union Minister and West Bengal BJP President Sukanta Majumdar was de-tained on Saturday while protesting against the gangrape incident at South Calcutta Law College in Kolkata. The party organised the protest at Gariahat Crossing in Kolkata. Waiving the BJP flags, they attempted to climb over the barricades guarded by police person-nel. The first-year student of South Calcutta Law Col-lege was allegedly raped on June 25 inside the college premises.

From ‘Saare Jahan Se’ To ‘Bharat Mata Ki Jai’: 41 Years Of Indian Space Glory

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Sharma's presence aboard the Soviet Salyut 7 space station during a joint Indo-Soviet mission turned him into a national hero overnight. His words in-spired generations of scien-tists, engineers, and school-children dreaming of the stars. Shukla's mission marks a generational leap for India, from piggybacking on the Soviet space programme to becoming a trusted partner in cutting-edge global mis-sions. The year 2025 deliv-ers that India is no longer an aspiring space partici-pant; it is a nation actively shaping the future of hu-man spaceflight. Plans for the Gaganyaan mission, India's first manned space-flight, are underway. The

Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) is eye-ing its own space station and even lunar missions. Amidst this, Shubhanshu Shukla, a 39-year-old Indian Air Force pilot, has become the first Indian to reach the ISS, as part of a NASA-Axiom Space commercial mission. His reflections, shared during an 18-minute video call with Prime Min-ister Narendra Modi, of-fered not just technical in-sight but emotional reso-nance. "From here, you don't see borders. You see one Earth," Shukla said. "India looks huge from here, bigger than on any map." In his call with PM Modi, Shukla spoke about the challenges of living in zero gravity, how even drinking water or sleeping requires

effort and adaptation. He humorously described strapping his feet down during the call to avoid float-ing mid-sentence. To which PM Modi re-sponded with, "Today you are farthest from the moth-erland but closest to the hearts of 140 crore Indi-ans." The Indian astronaut also spoke about sharing carrot halwa, moong dal halwa, and aamras with in-ternational crewmates aboard the ISS. "Everyone liked it," he said, adding, "They now want to visit India someday." While Sharma's 1984 jour-ney was a moment of sym-bolic pride, Shukla's 2025 mission is also a strategic milestone. It reflects India's transition from observer to active participant in global

space exploration. As India prepares to launch its own human spaceflight mission (Gaganyaan) and develop a Bhartiya Antariksha Sta-tion, Shukla's journey rein-forces national confidence. The two astronauts, un-der two Prime Ministers, now bookend four decades of Indian space ambition. Where Sharma's reply was poetic, Shukla's is declar-ative. Where Sharma flew under Soviet wings, Shukla carries India's flag to the ISS in collaboration with America. Shukla's message to the country carried the weight of history and the promise of the future. "This is not just my achievement. This is a collective leap for our country," he said, be-fore concluding with the words: "Bharat Mata ki Jai."

Puri Stampede: Rs 25 Lakh Financial Aid For Kins, 2 Officials Suspended



Puri Stampede: Follow-ing the tragic stampede during the Jagannath Rath Yatra in Puri, Odisha Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi on Sunday an-nounced Rs. 25 lakh in fi-nancial assistance for the families of those who lost their lives. Furthermore, Odisha Deputy Commis-sioner of Police (DCP) Vishnu Pati and Comman-dant Ajay Padhi have been suspended, following the incident in which at least three people died and sev-eral were injured. The mis-hap occurred early morning on Sunday near the Gundicha Temple in Puri. According to a post on X by the Odisha CMO, the

incident occurred during the world-famous Rath Yatra in Puri, as overcrowding led to the unfortunate demise of three devotees. **Probe On** The Chief Minister has also ordered a detailed ad-ministrative inquiry into the incident to be conducted under the supervision of the Development Commis-sioner. He also directed the transfer of the District Col-lector and Superintendent of Police (SP). Chanchal Rana has been appointed as the new District Collector, and Pinak Mishra as the new SP. **CM Seeks Forgiveness** Earlier on Sunday, CM Majhi apologised and

sought forgiveness from devotees, following the stampede during the Jagannath Rath Yatra in Puri. He further directed the authorities to initiate action against those re-sponsible. Posting on X, Chief Minister Majhi said, "Due to the intense eager-ness among devotees to have a glimpse of Mahaprabhu at Sharadhabali, an unfortu-nate incident occurred be-cause of the resulting jos-tling and chaos. Person-ally, my government and I seek forgiveness from all Jagannath devotees. We express our condolences to the families of those devotees whose lives were

lost at Sharadhabali and pray to Mahaprabhu Jagannath to grant them the strength to bear this profound sorrow." **Rahul Gandhi's Condo-lences** In a post on X, the Leader of Opposition (LoP) in Lok Sabha, Rahul Gandhi expressed his condolences to the families of the people who lost their lives and ap-pealed to the state govern-ment to expedite relief ef-forts. "The stampede in-cident during the Rath Yatra in Puri is extremely tragic. I express my deep condo-lences to the bereaved families and hope for the speedy recovery of the in-jured devotees," he wrote.

Amit Shah inaugurates National Turmeric Board

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Addressing the gather-ing, Amit Shah reaffirmed the Centre's commitment to the welfare of turmeric farm-ers, noting that Nizamabad is regarded as the turmeric capital of the country. "I feel fortunate to inaugurate the Turmeric Board, which be-came a reality thanks to the persistent efforts of BJP MPs. Not only was the board granted to Telangana, but a Telangana

native has also been ap-pointed as its chairman," he said. Shah highlighted turmeric's global signifi-cance, calling it a "divine medicine" with anti-viral, anti-bacterial, and anti-can-cer properties. "Our target is to achieve USD 1 billion in turmeric exports by 2030. Through this board, we will train farmers in modern cul-tivation techniques and work to improve their in-

comes through initiatives like the Bharati Cooperative Society," he added. Telangana Agriculture Minister Thummala Nageswara Rao expressed gratitude to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Union Home Minister Amit Shah, and MP Dharmapuri Arvind for sanctioning the Na-tional Turmeric Board for Nizamabad, a region known for its large-scale turmeric cultivation. 3,100 children take part in 21st Telangana Regional SIP Prodigy Contest 2025

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SIP Prodigy is an annual abacus and mental arith-metic competition. In a high-energy atmosphere filled with anticipation and enthusiasm, the children — dubbed "human calcula-tors" — attempted to solve over 200 arithmetic prob-lems in just 11 minutes, showcasing their abacus-powered mental math skills. The contest was con-ducted in two rounds, with 1,550 students competing in each session. Inaugurating the con-test, Sibi Sekhar, Director, SIP Academy, emphasized that "Abacus is beyond Mathematics. It builds es-sential life skills — con-centration, listening, memory, and a competitive

spirit — all of which lay the foundation for aca-demic excellence and con-fidence," he added. "Any competition has two out-comes -- one is the Win-ner, and the other is the Learner. Participation mat-ters more than winning or losing, it builds resilience and the spirit to grow." The Regional Winners of this contest will go on to represent Telangana at the International Prodigy Championship, to be held in November 2025 in Chennai, where over 5,000 children from 23 Indian States and 11 countries are expected to compete. A convocation ceremony was also held for 300 students, who com-pleted the prestigious Grand Master Level, the

most advanced stage of SIP Abacus training. Addressing media per-sons prior to the event, Sekhar shared the organization's ambitious ex-pansion plans. SIP Acad-emy, currently present in 23 Indian States and 11 coun-tries, plans to expand to Gujarat, parts of Uttar Pradesh, Australia, and other global markets. It has trained over one million chil-dren in two decades. Cur-rently, 1.75 lakh students are enrolled in 1,000 centres across India, facilitated by 5,000+ teachers, with pro-grams running in 1,500 schools. Bharath, Telangana State Head, an-nounced that SIP Academy has 71 centres in Telangana, training 10,300+ students,

with plans to scale up to 100 centres within a year. Uma Swaminathan high-lighted SIP Academy's green initiative — "Creat-ing a Forest", using the Miyawaki method, a Japa-nese technique to grow dense native forests. SIP has already created five such forests in Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Delhi, Maharashtra, and West Bengal. Plans are under-way to create the first Miyawaki forest in Telangana, in partnership with the State Forest De-partment. SIP's Prodigy Contests are known for scale and excellence, hav-ing earned six entries in the Limca Book of Records for record student partici-pation.

Kishan Reddy watches Mann Ki Baat with residents; calls for unanimous BJP state president election

Hyderabad, June 29 (UNI) Union Minister and BJP Telangana Chief G Kishan Reddy here on Sunday partici-pated in Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Mann Ki Baat programme viewing along with local residents at Moti Nagar in the Jubilee Hills constituency. Speaking on the occa-sion, Reddy said that the notification for the BJP Telangana state president's post would be issued this evening, and nominations will be accepted tomorrow in the presence of senior party leaders Sunil Bansal and Shobha Karandlaje, who are arriving in the state. He further informed that the new state president will be announced on July 1, and stressed that the elec-tion should be unanimous to reflect party unity. Tak-ing aim at Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, the Union Minister said, "Revanth is



speaking without proper un-derstanding. We are not working for him or for the Congress party, but solely for the people of Telangana." Reddy also announced the inauguration of the Turmeric

Board in Nizamabad by Union Home Minister Amit Shah. He reiterated the party's commitment to ad-dressing people's issues. On the infrastructure front, he revealed that the De-

tailed Project Report (DPR) for the Hyderabad Metro expansion had been sub-mitted to the Centre last week, and that the Central government is currently ex-amin-ing its feasibility.
