Drug trafficking

The Chief Minister vowed to crush the menace of drug use and trafficking in the State, warning that the prop-erties of offenders will be seized and welfare benefits withdrawn. “It must be clear that there should be no future for drug peddling and consumption of drugs as they are the enemies to the development of youth,” Mr. Naidu asserted, faulting the previous YSR Congress Party government of encouraging ganja cultivation in the North Andhra region and its largescale peddling. Blaming the previous government for irresponsible and negligent handling of the education sector, Mr. Naidu said that his government could successfully conduct a Mega DSC to appoint 16,347 teachers in a fool-proof and transparent mode.

Later, the Chief Minister along with Mr. Lokesh took part in the community lunch with students, parents and teachers. District Collector T.S. Chetan, SP V. Ratna, district MLAs and senior leaders of the Telugu Desam Party were present.

The Minister reiterated that the Mega DSC would be completed by the August end, and ensured 16,347 new teacher appointments, supply of free NEET/JEE coach-ing and study material to one lakh students in junior col-leges, and reintroduction of free textbooks and midday meals for the intermediate students of government junior colleges. He faulted the previous YSR Congress Party government for stalling the student-friendly move.

Referring to the appointment of Chaganti Koteswara Rao as a cabinet-rank advisor to foster value-based edu-cation, Mr. Lokesh said that under his guidance text-books and digital content promoting ethics and gender sensitivity were being modelled. He stressed the impor-tance of yoga, music, and sports as integral to the cur-riculum.

Calling for apolitical education reforms, Mr. Lokesh felt that schools would no longer carry political colours or leaders' photographs or images. He said that “results and not the rhetoric” must be the defining factor in the classrooms.

Concerning the “Drugs Vaddu Bro” campaign, the Minister reiterated the government’s stance against drug abuse. “We are also committed to promoting afforestation by introducing Green Passports, by engaging 45 lakhs students,” he said.

Modi’s five-nation visit a new era in India’s international ties: BJP

New Delhi, July 10 (UNI) As Prime Minister Narendra Modi returned after wrapping up a five-nation diplo-matic tour, the BJP termed it a "highly productive and successful" visit that has set a new era in India’s inter-national relations — strategic, cultural, and economic. Addressing a press briefing here, BJP national spokesperson Dr. Sudhanshu Trivedi highlighted the key outcomes of the PM’s diplomatic tour to Ghana, Trinidad & Tobago, Argentina, Brazil, and Namibia.

There are three major takeaways from the tour, the BJP MP said, pointing out, “The Prime Minister has unequivocally established India’s stance on terrorism at the BRICS summit, emphasizing that perpetrators and victims of terror cannot be equated — a significant diplomatic achievement.”

Calling the tour an economic success, Trivedi further noted India’s strengthened economic engagements with resource-rich countries such as Ghana and Namibia, where India has entered into agreements that promise to bolster future economic growth. “This marks a crucial step in securing vital minerals and metals,” he added. Culturally and socially, the visit reinforced India’s emo-tional connect with the Indian diaspora in these nations. Dr. Trivedi pointed to the example of the Prime Minister of Trinidad and Tobago Kamla Persad-Bissessar, who he said hails from Buxar in Bihar. The visit has elevat-ed India’s global role through enhanced cooperation with Africa and Global South countries, he added. The PM has unequivocally and categorically estab-lished the matter of terrorism at the BRICS.

“The perpetrators of terror and victims of terror cannot be equated. This was our diplomatic success. Then, countries like Ghana and Namibia, which are rich in metals and minerals, where India has entered into an agreement with these countries, which is important for the future. It is important from an economic aspect. “Also, the presence of the Indian diaspora in these countries, and the Prime Minister of Trinidad and Tobago, who is from Buxar, has taken India's emotion-al and social connect to a new dimension. So, strategi-cally, culturally, economically, this visit of the PM has set up a new era in India's role at the international level, with cooperation of the African and southern countries,” concluded the BJP leader.

Party cadres have raised complaints against a former YSRCP leader-turned-minister, accusing him of neglecting TDP workers.

Another minister from the Godavari region has faced criticism since the beginning of the term.

If these ministers are indeed dropped, Naidu will need to carefully balance social and regional representation while reconstituting the cabinet.

The Ax-4 crew took off aboard a SpaceX Dragon space-craft to the ISS from LC-39A at NASA's Kennedy Space Center on June 25 at 2:31 a.m. ET and after 28 hours journey arrived and docked at the ISS the next day and were greeted by NASA’s Expedition Crew for in the welcome ceremony.

From then on, they commenced their 14-day mission on the orbiting laboratory conducting microgravity research, technology demonstrations, and outreach engagements.

The Ax-4 mission “realized the return” to human space-flight for India, Poland, and Hungary, with each nation’s first government-sponsored flight in more than 40 years. While Ax-4 marks these countries' second human space-flight mission in history, it became the first time all three nations executed a mission on board the International Space Station.
