Two men promise land to old age home in Ahmedabad, cheat trustee of 85,000

A 35-year-old sofa-maker and trustee of a charitable trust has filed a complaint at the Naranpura police station, alleging that two individuals duped him of ₹85,000 under the pretext of donating land for his old age home. Maheshbhai Tulshibhai Darji, a resident of Gopikunj Society in Ahmedabad and trustee of the Lakshmidham Old Age Home, stated in his complaint that the accused, identified as Vijaybhai and Surendra, first

contacted his mother via phone on July 25. During the call, they inquired whether she was associated with the old age home and expressed their desire to donate land to the trust. As per the FIR, Maheshbhai later spoke to Vijaybhai, who claimed to be in a position to allocate a plot for the trust's use. He was later visited by Surendra, who took him on his bike to show a piece of land near Prahladnagar Garden, S G

Highway, allegedly offered by Vijaybhai. Believing the offer to be genuine, Maheshbhai informed Vijaybhai that the plot was suitable. On the pretext of completing legal formalities, Surendra and Vijaybhai allegedly convinced Maheshbhai to arrange ₹1.1 lakh, stating that ₹35,000 would go towards a lawyer's fee and ₹45,000 towards stamp duty, with the remaining meant for miscellaneous expenses.

Police registered a case against 74 landlords in 4 days for not registering the information of tenants on the police portal



Surat, Surat Police has started a special campaign in industrial areas and its surrounding areas to prevent crime and maintain law and

order in Surat city. The police has started strict action against landlords who rent out houses or shops without any documents or agreements. In just four days, Surat Police has taken action against more than 74 people who rented out their houses and shops without registering the details of the tenants on the police portal. These are especially the areas where people from outside Gujarat come to live and work in industries. In recent days, there has also been a significant increase in crime incidents in these areas, including areas like Sachin, Dindoli and Sachin GIDC.

Police active after Ashish Rajpara murder case It is legally mandatory to register the tenant's information on the police portal before renting out a house, yet landlords in many areas of the city do not follow this rule. Following the recent murder incident after robbery in the shop of businessman Ashish Rajpara in Sachin area, the police have started strict action in this direction. Following the directions of Police Commissioner Anupam Singh Gehlot, in the last four days, cases have been registered against more than 74 landlords in areas like Godadara, Sachin, Bhestan and Sachin GIDC, Dindoli under violation of notification. CCTV recording to be kept for 30 days

The police have clearly warned that if any landlord does not register his tenant, a case will be filed directly.

He was on his way to appear in a fight case and was hit, leaving the post office in an unregistered AUDI - video of the firing goes viral

Ahmedabad, In Shahibagh, Ahmedabad, the minor grandson of a bootlegger killed an innocent person yesterday (July 30) by driving a car at full speed. During the police investigation, it was found that this is not the first accident of the minor who committed the accident, earlier he had also killed a person in an accident at the age of 15. Apart from this, a video of the minor doing stunts by driving a car at a speed of 200, leaving the police station in an AUDI without a number plate, and firing has gone viral. It is worth mentioning that the grandson of Kishore Langda was wanted for a long time and when he was going to appear at the Infocity police station, he caused an accident in Shahibagh. He attacked Anish Rajpar and his friends in Gandhinagar. Amidst all this, the question arises that if the police had taken strict action and made him aware of the law when a minor died in an accident in 2022, then no innocent citizen would have died in an accident yesterday.

Kishore Langda's grandson was wanted for a long time and was trying to get acquainted to appear at Infocity Police Station. Yesterday, when he was going to appear at Infocity Police Station, he met with an accident. The female PSI of Infocity Police Station was waiting for a Fortuner car yesterday, when the car and the accused were caught by Ahmedabad Police. Kishore Langda's grandson attacked Anish Rajpar and his friends in Gandhinagar. Seven people got out of both the cars and attacked them over old enmity.

Anish Rajpar, a resident of Indrajit Society in Nikol village, had filed a complaint at Infocity police station a few days ago

about an attack on Kishore Langda's grandson. Anish has a bicycle showroom and is studying in the third year at the Automobile College at Monarch University. A few days ago, Anish had gone to Gandhinagar Gift City with his friends Mahipal and Manav for breakfast. When the three friends were going in an AUDI car, two Fortuners came. The driver of the Fortuner car intercepted the AUDI and beat up Anish, Mahipal and Manav. Seven people got out of both the cars and attacked them over old enmity. The attacker called himself Rathod and threatened to do whatever he wanted to you, and the Fortuner drivers attacked the three youths with weapons including sticks and knives, and fled. The mastermind of the attack called himself Rathod and also threatened to do whatever he wanted to you. Anish Rajpara had filed a complaint in this matter at the Infocity police station. In which the attackers were absconding. The Infocity police had filed a complaint against seven people, including the grandson of Kishore Langda. Investigation against the minor and his father who caused the accident Yesterday morning, 43-year-old Mahendrabhai, a resident of Asarwa, was going to school in his Activa near the Sardar Patel Memorial in Shahibaug. Meanwhile, the 17-year-old minor grandson of Asarwa's notorious bootlegger Kishore Langda, hit Mahendrabhai's Activa with a Fortuner at high speed, which collided with a rickshaw parked on the side of the road and a divider, in which he died on the spot due to serious head injuries. The F Division Traffic Police has started an investigation against the minor and his father regarding the

incident. In 3 years, he took the lives of two innocent people by driving despite not having a license. During the police investigation, it was found that the minor had also taken the life of an innocent person by driving a car in the year 2022, when he was less than 15 years of age, in the same way, he had taken the life of an innocent person by driving a car in an accident, that is, the minor has taken the lives of two innocent people by driving a car despite not having a license in the last three years. F Division PI RB Rathod said that since the person who caused the accident is a minor, a case of culpable homicide has been registered against his father.

Government employees to hold nationwide rally on OPS tomorrow

One and a half lakh employees from Gujarat will join; Fasting till 25 Nov, Twitter campaign, Dharna in Delhi and other programs

Rajkot NMOPS (National Movement for Old Pension Scheme) is going on across the country. For this, a protest rally of government employees is to be held in India on August 1. In it, about one and a half lakh government employees of Gujarat, including 6000 from Rajkot district who are under the new pension scheme, will raise the demand for the implementation of the old pension scheme. If the old pension scheme is still applicable for the government's MPs and MLAs, then why is the new pension scheme being forcibly implemented for government employees? The protest rally will be held with the question. Government employees will create a ruckus by organizing various agitational programs including fasting, Twitter campaign and dharna in Delhi from August 1 to November 25.

On one hand, when the monsoon season is going on, a teacher from Rajkot will protest against the old pension scheme with an umbrella. Similarly, in other districts of the country, employees of different government departments will protest against the new pension scheme in this manner.

Protest in three phases from August 1 to November 25 A protest rally has been organized in Rajkot city tomorrow (August 1, 2025) at 5:30 pm from Bahumali Bhawan Chowk to the Collector's office, in which more than 500 government employees including government teachers will join. In this regard, Piyush Bhuva, General Secretary of Rajkot City Primary Teachers' Association, said that a protest rally will be organized from August 1 across the country and then successive



agitational programs will be organized. This will include a hunger strike, a Twitter campaign and finally a dharna demonstration by NPS, i.e. New Pension Scheme employees from across the country, in Delhi on November 25, 2025.

He further said that there is a fight against privatization. These programs are against the government so that the old pension scheme is implemented for government employees. The government is currently investing all the money that is being deducted from government employees in NPS and UPS in the stock market and enriching industrialists. NPS (National Pension Scheme) and UPS (Unified Pension Scheme) are currently implemented, due to which when a teacher retires at the age of 58, he is entitled to only a pension of Rs 2000 to 4000, which is not right at all.

'Why not a new pension scheme for MLAs and MPs'

He further said that currently the old pension scheme is applicable for MLAs and MPs. If the new pension scheme is equally good, then why not implement the new pension scheme for MLAs and MPs?

This issue affects 6000

employees of Rajkot: Hitesh Rathod

While Rajkot Metropolitan Primary Teachers' Association Vice President Hitesh Rathod said that under the auspices of NMOPS, a protest rally has been organized on August 1 in protest against the New Pension Scheme and Unified Pension Scheme under the auspices of Rajkot Metropolitan Primary Teachers' Association. This issue affects about 1.5 lakh government employees across Gujarat, including 6000 from Rajkot city, including 700 from Rajkot city.

'Protest against teacher shortage and assignment of other work'

Our demand is that all government employees employed on April 1, 2025 should be given the benefit of the old pension scheme. Apart from this, other issues include teacher shortage in schools. There is a question of approving the pension of teachers who have been transferred to different districts in municipal schools. At the same time, there are issues of counting the service of HTAT principals as consecutive and transferring them. Apart from this, teachers are being kept busy in all work including election-related work, due to which the education of students is deteriorating, which is also a very big issue.
