The serious incident of beating and atrocities on innocent people in Haddad village of Botad district on October 12 has sparked debate at the political and social levels. Following this incident, on November 16, Rajula MLA Hirabhai Solanki and Divyesh Solanki, son of state minister Purushottam Solanki, visited the affected families door to door and consoled them.

Meanwhile, Hirabhai Solanki said that some elements are trying to 'put a gun on the shoulder of society'. Along with this, he also said that in a fit of rage, even the youth of our society do not do what is right.

During his visit to the families of the victims of the stampede,

Hirabhai Solanki described the incident as extremely sad. He spoke to the families of the victims and assured them that the government understands the seriousness of the incident and all necessary steps will be taken for justice.

What is the whole incident?

The controversy over the 'cheating' of cotton and other commodities in Botad APMC and giving low prices to farmers had taken a violent turn. Despite the police denying permission on October 12, the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) organized a farmers' Mahapanchayat in Haddad village of Botad. There was a heavy clash between the police who arrived to disperse the illegal gathering and the people who had gathered, in which stones were pelted at the police convoy and government

vehicles were vandalized.

Hirabhai Solanki said that it is our duty to go to any place where any kind of atrocities are committed against the society, and with the same spirit, we have visited Haddad village.

He added that efforts will be made to free the innocent people by holding a meeting with all the leaders. Students protest in Samaras Hostel

Over adulteration of oil, foul smell in kitchen, insufficient water; Health Department to investigate

Vadodara
Students of Samaras Hostel in Vadodara's Sama area had created a ruckus on the late night of November 16 over the issue of food items from another company instead of the prescribed company, cleanliness and inadequate water. Despite earlier representations, the students had not received any solution to this issue and had come out on the road in the bitter cold and created a huge ruckus against the management.

Allegation of mixing water in oil cans Students at Samaras Hostel in Sama area of ??Vadodara have alleged that instead of the quality flour of a particular company, flour from different companies is being sent for cooking rotis for students.

Due to which students often fall ill. Similarly, students have witnessed many cases of mixing oil from another company and water in the can of castor oil used in cooking.

Students have complained that there is no water supply and there are also allegations that the kitchen is also dirty and has a foul smell. Along with this, many students have had to face the problem of not having water while bathing and defecating in the toilet and bathroom in the hostel.

The tempo driver who brought the goods was taken by surprise

Last night, the students



of the hostel took the icer tempo driver who came with goods and things by surprise. The number of the contractor based in Gandhinagar was asked from the tempo driver, where the phone was repeatedly disconnected by making various excuses from the other end.

As a result, the students became more agitated. The students also told the questioning that they were caught red-handed when the castor oil can was filled with another company's oil. However, despite informing them in writing about other issues including the dirtiness of the kitchen, no response was received.

The students were caught red-handed in adulteration.

In addition, when the tempo driver arrived with the goods, no responsible person was present, so the students alleged that the system of Samaras Boys

Hostel had gone haywire and raised slogans to take appropriate action against those responsible. There was a huge uproar when they were caught red-handed in mixing water and other mixed oils in the can of castor oil.

After the late night commotion, the health department investigated

the Samaras Boys Hostel in the Sama area, which was found to be adulterated with water and other oils, a strong stench due to dirt in the kitchen, and several other defects, including the use of flour from another company instead of the specified company, in the case of roti flour.

On an immediate basis, the health department of the municipal administration, along with a team of officers and other personnel, conducted an intensive check at the Samaras Hostel and seized samples of some items for testing.

Female RFO still unconscious on 11th day after being shot in the head

Surat, Female RFO Sonal Solanki was shot by her RTO husband near Kamrej in Surat district. After being shot in the head, the bullet was removed after surgery, but even after 11 days, Sonalben has not regained consciousness and is currently hovering between life and death. For the last 11 days, more than 25 staff, including eight doctors, have been monitoring her condition day and night. However, this bullet has caused damage to her eyes, ears and brain. In a conversation with Divya Bhaskar, the doctor said that it is difficult to say anything

about the condition until Sonalben regains consciousness.

On November 6, RTO Inspector Husband had his friend fire on him.

Range Forest Officer (RFO) Sonal Solanki, who was on duty at the Adajan Forest Department office, was found injured near Kamrej in the early morning of November 6. The police were informed when the car of the female officer, who had left home for Adajan, was found stuck against a tree. When it was found that her son was also in the car, the police

immediately reached the spot. The seriously injured RFO was shifted to the government hospital for treatment. Along with this, the family members were informed about the incident.

The family members who reached the hospital shifted him to P.P. Savani Hospital, a private hospital in Surat, for treatment. Since he was unconscious, a CT scan was done at the private hospital. During the CT scan, it was found that he had been shot in the head. When it came out that it was not an accident at the RFO, but firing, the police

started an investigation with the help of FSL. In the police investigation, it was Ishwargiri Goswami who fired at Sonal Solanki on the instructions of her husband Nikunj Goswami, who was working in the RTO.

Even after 11 days of treatment, Sonal Solanki's condition is critical.

Dr. Jatin Mavani (Neurosurgeon, PP Savani Hospital) said that on November 6, female RFO Sonalben Solanki was brought to the emergency in an unconscious state. A CT scan revealed that there was a bullet in her brain. The bullet

was removed from the brain after a three-hour surgery. Sonalben's condition was very critical. The bullet was fired from the right side and it lodged in the left side of the brain. It was further said that the bullet stuck in the brain was surgically removed. However, the bullet has caused very serious damage. The bullet, which was shot from below the ear on the right side, first damaged the right ear. Then it tore out the eyeball. The left ear was also damaged after going to the left side. Along with this, all the muscles going from the right side to the left have also been cut. The first 72 hours were critical. However, even after that, there has been no significant improvement in his condition. After the condition improves, it gets worse again - The doctor further said that initially there was some movement. For the last 11 days, his condition is being monitored and is being monitored day and night by doctors and staff. His condition fluctuates. Initially, some movement was seen in the left eye and movement was also seen in the hand. As the days pass, his condition sometimes improves and then again the condition becomes critical. At present, there is no way to say what will happen to his condition further. It is difficult to say what will happen next as long as she is unconscious - The doctor further said that as long as Sonalben is unconscious, nothing can be said about what will happen next. Once she regains consciousness, it will be possible to say what kind of condition she will have. However, at present, there is a lot of damage to her eyes, both ears and brain. At present, her senses seem to be working. She has also been removed from the ventilator for a day and arrangements are being made to ensure that she can breathe and her condition is being monitored. Sonalben is being monitored day and night by a staff of 25, including 8 doctors. He further said that since Sonalben was brought to the hospital on November 6, 8 doctors, including me, have been continuously monitoring her condition.

Foreign liquor worth ?5 crore seized in 3 days in dry state Gujarat

Liquor worth ?1.25 crore found twice in Kadi; Liquor cutting was going on and Bavlu police raided, seized ?1.31 crore worth of liquor

Kadi
Foreign liquor worth Rs 5 crore has been seized in 3 days in the dry state of Gujarat. In this, liquor worth Rs 1.25 crore has been seized twice in three days in Kadi taluka of Mehsana district. Last night (November 16), foreign liquor worth Rs 1.25 crore has been seized within the limits of Bavlu police station. Earlier, the State Monitoring Cell (SMC) team had raided late on November 14 and seized a large quantity of foreign liquor near Kadi. Liquor worth Rs 1.38 crore was being smuggled in through pilotage. While last night, Sunday, Bavlu police seized liquor worth Rs 1.25 crore. Liquor cutting was going on in a field near the canal in front of Surya Farm on the road from Dalla village to Kalyanpura and the police raided it.

Earlier on November 15, the Local Crime Branch (LCB) team of Chhota Udepur district police had seized foreign liquor worth 72.50 crore from a cement tanker near the railway yard near Pavi Jetpur. Liquor cutting once again caught in Kadi taluka

A large quantity of foreign liquor was once again caught from the Bavlu police station area of ??Kadi taluka on Sunday. Based on the information, the police raided a farm near the canal opposite Surya Farm on the outskirts of Dalla village and seized foreign liquor worth more than Rs. 1 crore 31 lakh and arrested two accused. The police have registered a case in this matter and are conducting further investigation.

How was the quantity of liquor seized?

PI of Bavlu Police Station S.R. Chaudhary instructed the police staff to patrol. During

that time, policeman Darshan Singh received specific information that foreign liquor was being 'cut' in a field near the canal opposite Surya Farm on the road from Della village to Kalyanpura. Based on this information, the staff including the PI immediately reached the spot. While checking the sorghum field, the police found boxes and bottles of foreign liquor lying scattered. After that, the police also seized a large quantity of liquor from the field and from an icer truck (No. GJ 1 KT 8440) lying in an open space on the road from Della village to Thothoda.

Two accused arrested, four absconding Police arrested two persons named Saddam Hussain Hussainbhai Sheikh and Mohammad Arif Ibrahimbhai Sheikh (both residents of Danilimda, Ahmedabad) during the raid. During the preliminary interrogation, the arrested accused confessed that Sarfaraz Bismillakh Pathan (resident of Danilimda, Shah Alam, Ahmedabad), Syed Sahil alias Vasuli (resident of Danilimda), Harun (resident of Juhapura, Ahmedabad) and Harun Bachubhai Belim (resident of Della, Kadi) had together ordered this quantity of foreign liquor and were going to cut it and load it in different vehicles.

Seized goods and action taken

The police seized a total of 16,836 bottles of foreign liquor from the farm and the icer truck, worth Rs. 1,21,62,240. Including the liquor, icer truck and other goods, the police seized a total of Rs. 1,31,72,240 worth of goods. The police have registered a case under the Prohibition Act against the two arrested accused and four other absconding people and

are taking legal action. It is worth noting that a few days ago, a quantity of foreign liquor worth more than Rs. 50 lakh was seized by the Bavlu police from an oil mill in Kalyanpura.

A team of the State Monitoring Cell (SMC) has seized a large quantity of foreign liquor from Kadi near the city late on November 14, creating a stir in the entire district. The police have seized a total of 18,651 bottles of foreign liquor worth 21,38,06,810 and other items. The Creta and Fortuner cars were piloting in front of the teller.

Liquor smuggling under the guise of straw:

A trailer (truck) of Rajasthan Parsing was inspected by the officials and found to be filled with straw (straw) inside, under the guise of which foreign liquor boxes were hidden. A total of 18,651 bottles of different brands were found during the inspection, whose market value is estimated at 21,38,06,810.

The SMC team arrested tailor driver Hari Kishan Madanlal Suthar (Resident of Godam near Navi Masjid, District Bikaner) and informed the Kadi police for further action. A detailed examination of the trailer using the wrong number plate revealed various documents. The original registration number of the trailer was found to be RJ 7 GS 4635, while the wrong number plate RJ 7 GC 1081 was affixed on it. This quantity of liquor was loaded into the trailer and sent to Kadi, Gujarat.

A big revelation was made during the interrogation.

When the trailer driver Hari Kishan Suthar was questioned by the SMC officials, he made some important revelations.
