In case of power outage in 110 mandals, 3,211 generators should be kept ready for power backup. It was clarified that people in coastal areas should be shifted to safe areas and rehabilitation centers and 25 kg of rice and other essential commodities should be distributed to them. Officials explained to the CM that Cyclone Montha, currently centered 680 km from Kakinada, is moving towards the coast at a speed of 16 km per hour. Due to its impact, rains have already started in coastal Andhra Pradesh and there is a possibility of very heavy rains in Krishna district on Tuesday. Heavy rains are also expected in Guntur, Bapatla, NTR, Palnadu and West Godavari districts. He said that the cyclone is likely to reach the coast on Tuesday night. He said that holidays have already been declared for educational institutions and all the fishermen who went to sea have been brought back. The CM ordered that the authorities should be on full alert , NDRF and SDRF teams should be ready, and fire personnel should also be on alert. He said that if the roads are damaged, electric poles and trees fall, the necessary machinery and equipment should be prepared to immediately undertake restoration work. He suggested that special measures should be taken to prevent the spread of infectious diseases due to lack of sanitation after the cyclone. He said that 108 and 104 vehicles should be made available for pregnant women and nursing moth-

The government is fully prepared. Minister Anitha said that the government machinery has been alerted on the orders of Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu since the cyclone warnings were issued. For the past three days, she explained that she has been reviewing the situation from the RTGS center from time to time along with CM Chandrababu Naidu and IT Minister Nara Lokesh and has alerted all departments. She said that a solid plan has been prepared so that the district collectors and SPs in the cyclone-affected areas, as well as the officers and staff of all departments, work in coordination. He said that special officers have been appointed for the districts to monitor the situation at the field level and necessary funds have also been released for relief operations. He said that control rooms have been set up to provide information to the people from time to time and the real situation is being explained through the media. said that some people are spreading rumors that the cyclone is already having severe effects in the surrounding areas of Kakinada, as Cyclone Montha is expected to cross the state coast tomorrow night. However, he clarified that there is no truth in this propaganda and that the weather in Kakinada is currently calm.He advised people not to worry and to follow the

alerted the authorities. He held a review with the district collectors and SPs through a teleconference on the cyclone preparedness. He issued clear instructions to the officials to ensure that there is no lapse in the relief efforts and to stand by the people. On this occasion, CM Chandrababu made a key announcement. He ordered that Rs. 3,000 be provided as immediate assistance to each family taking shelter in the rehabilitation centers set up due to the cyclone. In addition, he suggested that 25 kg of rice and other essential

also called on the workers of the coalition parties to participate in the relief operations if necessary. He ordered that relief camps be set up immediately for the people in the coastal areas and villages affected by the cyclone. He clarified that facilities such as food and drinking water needed by the homeless should be kept ready in those camps.Minister Lokesh said that there is a risk of epidemics spreading due to heavy rains, and to prevent this, the medical and health

IMD warns of heavy rain in TN, AP, Odisha

over the Arabian Sea and Bay of Bengal intensify into Cyclone Montha, expected to make landfall on Tuesday. The IMD has warned of heavy rain, strong winds, and possible flooding across Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Odisha and Puducherry. The Indian Army is working closely with the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA), IMD, and respective state administrations to ensure a swift and coordinated response once the storm makes landfall. Officials said the army has activated its Disaster Response Columns (DRCs) across southern and eastern regions, with dedicated and reserve units deployed in Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Kerala, West Bengal, and the Lakshadweep Islands. Control rooms have been set up for 24-hour coordination with disaster agencies to enable timely evacuation, relief, and rescue operations. According to the IMD's latest forecast issued on Sunday, a deep depression over the southeast Bay of Bengal about 610 km west of Port Blair and 790 km east-southeast of Chennai, is expected to intensify into Cyclone Montha within 24 hours. The system is likely to strengthen further into a severe cyclonic storm by October 28 before crossing the Andhra Pradesh coast between Machilipatnam and Kakinada that evening or night. Wind speeds are expect-

ed to reach 90–100 kmph, gusting to 110 kmph, when the cyclone makes landfall. Coastal districts of Andhra Pradesh, north Tamil Nadu, and Odisha are forecast to experience heavy to very heavy rain, along with squally winds and rough sea conditions. Meanwhile, a depression over the east-central Arabian Sea, located nearly 700 km west-southwest of Mumbai, is expected to move further westwards over the next day. While it is unlikely to make direct landfall, the system could intensify local sea conditions and add to rainfall activity along India's west coast. The IMD has issued an orange alert for Chennai, Tiruvallur, Chengalpattu, K a n c h e e p u r a m , Villupuram, Ranipet, and

Puducherry. These districts are expected to receive heavy rainfall accompanied by strong winds on Sunday and Monday. The Regional Meteorological Centre (RMC) in Chennai warned that rainfall activity will intensify on Monday and gradually move northward by Tuesday as the storm approaches the Andhra coast. District administrations have been asked to remain on high alert, with disaster-management teams on standby to tackle flooding and power disruptions. Fishermen have been advised not to venture into the sea, as winds over the central and adjoining Bay of Bengal may reach 100 kmph and create dangerous sea conditions.

The Chief Minister reviewed the developing situation from the Real Time Governance Centre (RTGS) at the Secretariat and instructed authorities to monitor the cyclone's movement hour-to-hour and take zero-risk measures, especially in coastal and low-lying habitations. The CM has also appealed to citizens to stay indoors and remain vigilant until all-clear instructions are issued. The government has placed the administration on maximum alert. The cyclone is expected to make landfall near Kakinada on Tuesday night with 90–110 kmph winds and heavy to extremely heavy rainfall across multiple districts. Minister for Real Time Governance Nara Lokesh is coordinating inter-departmental response, communication systems, and district-level readiness. He directed all municipal bodies and district administrations to operate 24/7 control rooms, ensure uninterrupted communication, and issue alerts through RTGS, Andhra Pradesh State Disaster Management Authority (APSDMA) and local networks. Officials said that vulnerable populations, including pregnant women, the elderly and coastal belt residents, shifted to safer locations. A total of 260 relief centres have been opened in Kakinada district and 140 in Nellore district, with food, milk and water stocked for 2–3 days. The authorities have also readied 364 schools as cyclone shelters. Over 14,000 schools in the districts like to be affected have been given a precautionary holiday. The departments concerned have closed all beaches closed while fishermen have been prohibited from venturing into sea. Red alert has been issued for Kakinada, Konaseema, West Godavari, Krishna, Bapatla, Prakasam and Nellore districts. According to an official statement, 11 teams of NDRF and 12 teams of SDRF have been positioned for rescue, evacuation and flood response. Fire services, swimmers, OBM boats, life jackets, and emergency equipment are placed across coastal zones. The officials have activated the 108/104 ambulance network and medical camps in all cyclone shelters. The RTGS war room is running 24/7, tracking rainfall, wind, inundation, reservoirs, traffic, and field alerts. Satellite phones, V-SATs, digital radios, repeaters, and wireless support are pre-positioned to prevent network failure. Hourly situation reports are being shared with the government and District Collectors. The departments concerned have deployed JCBs, power saws, and dewatering pumps across vulnerable stretches. The electricity department's rapid restoration teams are stationed with transformers, poles, conductors, and generators in coastal districts. Rural Water Supply tankers, chlorine tablets, bleaching powder, and safe drinking water backups are kept ready. Sufficient rice, essentials, and relief stock are positioned at Mandal Level Stock Points. Emergency drug stocks, boat clinics, and Rapid Response Medical Teams have mobilised for health support. To enable immediate relief work, the government has authorised withdrawal of funds under TR-27 for rescue, evacuation, medical care, food, drinking water, sanitation and road clearance. Additional funds may be drawn by severely affected districts as needed, the government said.

Govt committed to develop Temples: Anam

When the issue brought to the notice of Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu, he immediately accepted to release funds for the reconstruction of temples, he added. Anam said as part of the initiative to protect ancient culture, the government has decided to run temples situated on hillocks and forest areas itself from now on. The Minister said it was also decided to construct village deities by spending Rs 5 lakh for each structure and as part of this. Rs 3.5 crore were sanctioned for the construction of 77 Village Deities temples in Atmakuru constituency. Earlier, Minister Anam laid foundation stone for construction of water tank with Rs 51 lakh under Jal Jeevan Mission in the village. Atmakur RDO Pavanani and local leaders were present.

Further, breaking down the procedure, he informed that the BLOs will first distribute the enumeration forms to electors, enabling them to verify their details on their own via 'digital linking' to previous records. "If there has been no change since 2003, no linking with old EPIC cards needs to be done but those who don't have names linked to prior records, they will need to submit any of the documents as sought by the poll panel," he said. "BLOs will visit every house, three times," he informed. Draft and final voter list will be published by EROs and Deputy EROs as it is incumbent upon them to publish error-free electoral rolls. MP Shivnath's efforts in the development of Kondapalli Railway Station have yielded results

Vijayawada, October 27(Skyline Correspondent) The efforts of MP Kesineni Sivanath, in coordination with Mailavaram constituency MLA Vasanta Krishna Prasad, to remove the difficulties faced by passengers due to the lack of a proper platform for boarding and alighting trains at Kondapalli Railway Station, have borne fruit. The proposal made by MP Kesineni Sivanath for the expansion and height increase of the platform at Kondapalli Railway Station has been approved in the South Central Railway Umbrella Works 2024-25. The work of expanding and height increase of the platforms at Kondapalli Railway Station will begin soon. South Central Railway General Manager (GM) Sanjay Kumar Srivastava informed MP Kesineni Sivanath about this in a letter. He also informed that MP Kesineni Sivanath's proposal for development of Kondapalli Railway Station under the Amrut Station Scheme will be considered in the next phase. On this occasion, MP Kesineni Sivanath thanked Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Union Railway Minister Ashwin Vaishnav and Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu. MP Kesineni Sivanath inspected Kondapalli Railway Station in Mylavaram constituency on June 3 along with MLA Vasanta Krishna Prasad. Along with MLA Krishna Prasad, railway officials and passengers explained the problems at Kondapalli Railway Station. Passengers said that the main problem is the lack of a proper platform at the station. Currently, Kondapalli Station has only a 366-meter-long platform. Out of which, 136 meters is high-level and the remaining 230 meters is a low-level platform. Due to this, passengers are facing many difficulties in boarding and alighting from trains. To immediately resolve the railway issues under the Vijayawada Railway Division and remove the difficulties faced by people at the multi-level crossings, MP Kesineni Shivnath personally met Railway General Manager (GM) Sanjay Kumar Srivastava at Rail Nilayam in Secunderabad on August 22. At that time, in addition to expanding the platforms at Kondapalli Railway Station so that passengers can board the coaches comfortably and providing necessary infrastructure facilities for passengers, MP Kesineni Shivnath requested GM Sanjay Kumar Srivastava through a letter to him to modernize Kondapalli Railway Station under Amrita Bharat 2.0.
