A convention center like Mahatma Mandir in Gandhinagar will be built in Rajkot

45 thousand plots of land will be allotted near Atal Sarovar, two and a half lakh industrialists of Saurashtra-Kutch will get benefit.



Rajkot, Industrialists of Saurashtra-Kutch will get a world-class convention center at their doorstep for various exhibitions. Industrialists from across Saurashtra, including Rajkot, had been demanding a convention center from the government for years, which has been approved by the state government and a special amount of Rs. 50 crore has been allocated for this convention center in the budget of the current financial year. At that time, more than 45 thousand plots of land have been allocated by the administration to build a

convention center near Atal Sarovar on the Smart City area of Rajkot, i.e. the Second Ring Road, and after preparing the design, efforts have been started to build a modern convention center within the next three years.

With the establishment of this convention center, more than 2.50 lakh industrialists from across Saurashtra, including Rajkot, will directly benefit from this and they will have the facility to exhibit their business products at home, not in Ahmedabad, Mumbai or Delhi, but in Rajkot, so that the development of Saurashtra will also progress

well. Saurashtra industries will have facilities at home for exhibitions Rajkot city is a city known across the country for its automobile, engineering and imitation market. Apart from this, Morbi is considered a ceramic hub next to Rajkot, while Jamnagar is considered a hub for the brass part industry. All these industries should get a suitable platform. In order to benefit more than 2.50 lakh industrialists from across Saurashtra, so that they do not have to go to cities like Gandhinagar Mahatma Mandir, Mumbai or Delhi for exhibitions, the government has announced to build a bigger and larger convention center in Rajkot than Gandhinagar. For this, space has been allocated in the first phase, later, after deciding one agency after another in phases and completing the tender process, preparations have been started to build a modern convention center in Rajkot within the next three years.

Ahmedabad couple divorces over eating onions and garlic

Wife used to eat separately and husband and mother-in-law used to eat separately; Dispute finally reaches High Court

A strange case of divorce has come to light in Ahmedabad. A couple had an argument over eating onions and garlic in their meals. The arguments escalated to such an extent that within 11 years of marriage, the matter reached the point of divorce. When the wife kept taking the child, the husband filed a divorce petition in the family court, stating that his wife's dietary restrictions were unbearable, which was approved. Later, the couple approached the Gujarat High Court in this matter, where the court dismissed the wife's appeal challenging the divorce.

The couple started having arguments over food.

The details of this case are that the woman was a follower of the Swaminarayan sect and hence strictly avoided eating onions and garlic, but there was no such restriction on the husband and mother-in-law. The couple got married in 2002, but the choice of cuisine became a disaster for their married life. Gradually, domestic disputes increased and the relationship soured. The wife regularly participated in prayers and religious rituals and followed the rules of the sect. The husband and mother-in-law did not want to change their eating habits, as a result, arrangements were made to cook separately in the house.

The husband filed for divorce after his wife left the house,

and the divided kitchen was finally ending the marital relationship. The wife left her husband's house with the child. In 2013, the husband

filed for divorce in the Ahmedabad Family Court. He claimed that his wife had abandoned him by committing cruelty against him. On May 8, 2024, the Family Court granted the divorce and ordered the husband to pay maintenance.

The husband challenged the maintenance order in the High Court.

Later, both the parties approached the High Court, where the wife appealed against the divorce and sought enforcement of the maintenance amount. While the husband challenged the maintenance order. The wife's lawyer submitted in the High Court that the husband had claimed in the Family Court that his habit of avoiding onions and garlic due to his wife's religious beliefs was causing fights and she was adamant in her stand. The Family Court accepted the husband's claim.

The husband asked to deposit the maintenance amount in the court registry.

The husband's lawyer argued that his client and his mother used to cook food for the wife without onions and garlic. The consumption of onions and garlic was the main reason for the differences between the two. The husband told the High Court that he had to apply at the Mahila Police Station as well. At one point in the High Court, the wife said that she no longer had any objection to the divorce. The husband replied in the High Court that he would deposit the remaining maintenance amount in the court registry in installments, which amount would be given to his wife.

Firing in a joke behind closed doors in a flat in Ahmedabad

Three friends were having fun in a flat in Shivalik Residency in Lambha area of Ahmedabad late at night when a country-made pistol suddenly fired, hitting a minor and he fell to the ground. The minor's condition is still critical. The accused Siddharth Bhumihar and Rohit Prajapati threw the country-made pistol in the garbage in panic, which

the police are searching for. As soon as the incident was reported, the police have rounded up both the youths.

Siddharth Bhumihar (originally a migrant), a bank employee living in Shivalik Residency in Lambha area, was alone at home yesterday. Since no one was home, he called his friend Rohit Prajapati and a minor to his house. The three were having fun late at night. During this, Siddharth suddenly fired from a country-made pistol, the bullet of which hit the minor directly and he fell on the ground. Hearing the sound of firing in the silence of the night, the residents also ran out.

The frightened Siddharth and Rohit immediately informed the minor's parents. Hearing the sound of firing in the silence of the night, the residents of the society also ran out. The injured minor was immediately shifted to the hospital, where his condition is still critical. As soon as the incident was reported, the police reached the spot and started a thorough investigation. The police arrested both the youths who opened fire. The police have arrested the two youths who fired the shots, Siddharth Bhumihar and Rohit Prajapati. During interrogation, both of them confessed to the crime and Siddharth said that while having fun, his hand suddenly pressed the trigger of the country-made pistol, due to which the bullet directly hit the minor. The accused have also confessed that in panic, they threw the weapon into a garbage heap, which the police are currently searching for. A young man from Ahmedabad lost his life while firing a revolver at a woman as a joke. Playing with his licensed revolver became the cause of death for the young man.

Mega demolition at Kandla's Mitha Port

500 policemen deployed with 20 JCBs and 100 tractors, 100 acres of land worth Rs 250 crores will be opened



Kutch (Bhuj)

Mega demolition operation has been underway at Mitha Port of Kandla in Gandhidham taluk of Kutch district since early morning today. This operation is being carried out with the tight deployment of 500 police personnel along with 20 JCBs and 100 tractors. By evening, 100 acres of land worth Rs 250 crores will be cleared.

The Deendayal Port Authority (DPA) and East Kutch District Police have jointly started this operation from early morning, which will continue till evening. Around 40 officers and 500 police personnel have been deployed from East Kutch district to relieve the pressure.

This area is notorious for bootleggers and

this mega demolition is being done keeping in mind maritime security and national security. The area had a population of around



4,000 to 5,000 people. This pressured area was notorious for crimes against persons, property and known prohibition bootleggers. In particular, the area was seen to have a high incidence of crimes related to the Petroleum Act and the Damage to Public Property Act.

Action with videography through drones:

In this mega operation, about 20 JCBs, 20 Hitachis, 40 loaders, 40 dumpers, 100 tractors and drones and cameras are being used for videography. While relieving the pressure, a large convoy of all police officers including the East Kutch Police Chief, LCB, SOG and Kandla Police

has been deployed for security.

Anjar Deputy Police Chief Mukesh Chaudhary said that the work of demolishing the illegal construction in this area is currently underway. The residents of this area, most of whom are involved in criminal activities. This is an area of 100 acres, which is worth about 250 crores. Around four to five thousand people live here, to whom notices were given earlier also.

Pressures were removed in Gandhidham about a month ago.

About a month ago, the Gandhidham Municipal Corporation removed 104 concrete pressures on the Collector Road with police security. Notices were given to the pressurers earlier, but when the locals did not remove the pressures, the administration removed these pressures after the deadline expired.

After Chandola Lake in Ahmedabad, the biggest mega demolition was done 15 days ago at Isanpur Lake in the eastern area of ??the city. Like Chandola Lake, Isanpur Lake was home to more than 1,000 people. The operation to remove all the pressure was started early on

November 24, in which 20 JCB machines, 500 municipal corporation employees and laborers were deployed under tight police security.
