Auto Union Leaders Demand Immediate Repairs to Drainage Canal near RTC Bus Stand

Pileru, December 23: The Masha Allah Auto Union leaders have urged the concerned authorities to expedite the completion of repairs to the drainage canal. Speaking to the media on Monday morning, union president Mr. Chanu and secretary Mr. Mahaboob Basha expressed deep concern over the financial struggles faced by the auto drivers due to the ongoing delay in the repair work.

The auto stand near the RTC Bus Stand has served

as a central hub for transporting passengers to and from Pileru town for several decades, offering convenient services to commuters. However, incomplete repairs to the drainage canal on the main road leading from the RTC Bus Stand have caused significant disruption. The blockage has forced commuters to use alternative routes, bypassing the auto stand entirely.

This diversion has drastically reduced the number of passengers utilizing auto services from the stand, directly impacting

the daily earnings of the drivers. Many of these drivers rely solely on their income from the stand to support their families and are now facing severe financial hardships.

The union leaders appealed to the authorities to prioritize the completion of the drainage canal repairs on a war footing. They stressed that swift action would not only restore travel convenience for residents but also help revive the livelihoods of the auto drivers who depend on the

proper functioning of the stand.

"We urge the concerned officials to address this issue without further delay. The prolonged disruption is causing immense distress, both for the commuters and for the auto drivers whose families depend on this income," said Mr. Chanu. The Masha Allah Auto Union remains hopeful that the authorities will respond promptly and take the necessary measures to resolve the problem, ensuring the welfare of both the drivers and the passengers.

"Intention To Dupe UPSC": Ex-IAS Trainee Puja Khedkar Denied Pre-Arrest Bail

New Delhi: The Delhi High Court has denied anticipatory bail to former IAS trainee officer Puja Khedkar, who made headlines in June and August amid claims she lied about physical and mental disabilities, and changed her name and surname, as well as forging an OBC certificate, to clear the exam. The court said her intentions, prima facie, were to dupe authorities and observed "her steps (were) part of a larger conspiracy. Ms Khedkar, it was also observed, is "unfit for appointment". The charges against her, which include forgery and cheating, are a "classic example of fraud committed not only an authority but also the nation at large", the court said Monday afternoon.

"Conduct of the petitioner was purely driven with a motive to dupe the complainant UPSC, or the Union Public Service Commission, and all documents allegedly forged by her were done to reap benefits of schemes meant for the (disadvantaged) groups of the society," the court said.

"The investigation in the present case, as per material available on the record, prima facie reveals the petitioner is not a fit candidate to avail benefits meant for disadvantaged groups..."

In a significant mention, the court also indicated "a high possibility that family members (of Ms Khedkar) may have colluded with unknown powerful persons in order to get the certificates...", possibly expanding the investigation to include government officials and departments.

The order was passed by a single-judge bench of Justice Chandra Dhari Singh, who had earlier granted Ms Khedkar temporary protection from arrest. That will likely now stand cancelled. On August 1 a city court had rejected her plea. In her arguments, Ms Khedkar doubled down on physical disability claims - she has a Maharashtra hospital certificate diagnosing her with an "old ACL (anterior cruciate ligament) tear with left knee instability" - and asked, therefore, that only attempts in the 'divyang'



category be counted.

She also claimed only her middle name had been altered and argued "therefore, there is no truth in the allegation that there has been a major change in my name". "UPSC verified my identity through biometric data... did not find my documents (to be) fake or incorrect..." she argued. Ms Khedkar's bail plea had been opposed both by the Delhi Police and the UPSC, which rejected the argument she be given bail on a promise to cooperate fully and because the material against her is documentary in nature, and therefore her custody isn't needed. The police's counterargument was that Ms Khedkar's custody

was needed to interrogate her and unearth the involvement of others in the commission of the offence. The cops also said relief to Ms Khedkar could hinder its inquiry into the "deep-rooted conspiracy" behind the alleged crime.

The UPSC, meanwhile, argued Ms Khedkar had committed a fraud against the public, and that her custody is needed for the cops to unearth a fraud that would have needed help from other individuals. In early September the union government sacked Ms Khedkar, who has denied all charges against her and claimed she is being targeted since she filed a sexual harassment against her senior.

Centre scraps 'No-Detention' policy for classes 5 and 8 students failing Year-End Exams

New Delhi: In a big change in school education, the Centre has scrapped the 'no-detention policy' for classes 5 and 8 in schools governed by it, allowing them to fail students who do not clear the year-end exams, according to officials. At least 16 states and two Union Territories have already done away with the 'no-detention policy' for the two grades after an amendment to the Right to Education Act

(RTE) in 2019. According to an official notification, if students fail to clear the annual exams, they will be given additional coaching and an opportunity to take a re-exam within two months of the results.

"If the child appearing in the re-examination fails to fulfil the promotion criteria again, he shall be held back in fifth class or eighth class, as the case may be. During the holding back of the child, the class teacher shall



guide the child as well as the parents of the child, if necessary, and provide specialised inputs after identifying the learning gaps at various stages of

assessment," the notification said. But no child can be expelled by any school until their education is complete, the government has clarified.

Bengaluru Techie Loses Rs.11.8 Crore After "Digital Arrest"

Bengaluru: A 39-year-old software engineer became a victim to a "digital arrest" scam and lost Rs.11.8 crore when fraudsters impersonating police officials claimed that his Aadhaar card was being misused to open bank accounts for money laundering, police said. The fraud occurred between November 25 and December 12, they said. According to police, in his complaint, the victim alleged that on November 11, he received a call from a person who claimed to be an officer of the Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI). The alleged officer claimed that his SIM card, which was linked to the Aadhaar card, was used for illegal advertisements and harassing messages. The fraudster further alleged that a case was registered in connection with this in Mumbai's Colaba Cyber Police Station. Later, he got a call from a person claiming to be a police officer alleging that his Aadhaar details were being misused to open bank accounts for money laundering, the FIR stated. The fraudster warned him to keep the matter confidential and also allegedly threatened him that if he did not cooperate with the virtual investigation, he would be physically arrested. Then, he also got a call from a person asking him to download the Skype app following which a man, allegedly dressed in Mumbai police uniform video-called him and claimed that a businessman had opened a bank account using his Aadhaar to conduct transactions worth ? 6 crore, the FIR further stated. However, on November 25, another man in police uniform called him over Skype and alleged that his case was being heard in the top court and threatened to arrest his family if he did not comply, according to the complainant. Citing a fake Reserve Bank of India (RBI) guidelines, the fraudsters allegedly asked him to transfer funds to certain accounts on the pretext of "verification purposes" or face legal consequences.

Mohan Babu's anticipatory bail denied: Shocking setback in journalist attack case

Hyderabad: In a setback to veteran actor Manchu Mohan Babu in the case relating to an attack on a journalist, the Telangana High Court on Monday dismissed his petition for anticipatory bail. Mohan Babu had sought anticipatory bail on health grounds. His counsel had submitted to the court that he was suffering from health problems related to heart and nerves. The court also said that Mohan Babu is currently in Tirupati. After recently visiting Dubai to see his grandson, Mohan Babu went to

Tirupati to look after the functioning of his educational institutions. However, the public prosecutor opposed the anticipatory bail petition. After hearing the arguments, the court dismissed the petition for anticipatory bail. The veteran actor, who is also a former Member of Parliament, was booked for an attempt to murder after he attacked a reporter of a television channel after grabbing the mike. The reporter was injured and was admitted to a hospital. The incident occurred on the night of December 10 during the



chaos at Mohan Babu's house in Jalpally, which was sparked by a dispute with his actor son, Manchu Manoj. Rachakonda Police initially registered a case under Bharat Nyaya

Sanhita (BNS) Section 118 (1) (causing hurt with dangerous weapons or substances) against Mohan Babu, and later added Section 109 (attempt to murder).
