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CM Chandrababu Greenlights Rs.2,723 Crore for Amaravati Development

In the latest move, the Chief Minister has approved Rs. 2,723 crore for new projects in the region. These decisions were taken during the 44th meeting of the Capital Region Development Authority (CRDA). Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu directed officials to complete and inaugurate 1.18 lakh Tidedo housing units by June 12. Additionally, the government has decided to

enhance basic infrastructure in Land Pooling Scheme (LPS) Zone 7 and Zone 10. Discussions during the meeting also included progress on the Amaravati Ring Road and the Vijayawada Bypass Road projects. The CRDA has so far approved projects worth ₹47,288 crore for the development of the Amaravati capital region.

In line with his promise made during the "Palle Panduga" program, Pawan Kalyan inspected the ongoing road construction work connecting Godavaru village to Royyuru village in Thotlavalluru Mandal. The reforms he implemented as the Prime Minister changed the course of the country, Naidu posted on 'X'. "On the occasion of PV's death anniversary, I pay tribute to the memory of the multi-faceted genius," wrote Naidu. Telangana Pradesh Congress Committee (TPCC) president B. Mahesh Kumar Gound visited PV Gyan Bhoomi in Hyderabad to pay tributes to Narasimha Rao on his 20th death anniversary. "Words fall short to describe P. V. Narasimha Rao ji. He was truly a lifelong learner," said the Congress leader. Union Minister for Coal and Mines G. Kishan Reddy, Telangana Transport Minister Ponnampallabhar, Government Advisor K. Kesava Rao and members of Narasimha Rao's family also paid tributes at PV Gyan Bhoomi.

Bharat Rashtira Samithi (BRS) working president K.T. Rama Rao paid rich tributes to the economist, politician, polyglot, Bharat Ratna former Prime Minister PV Narasimha Rao on his death anniversary. He termed PV as the pride of Telangana. "His birth in Telangana is a source of pride for all of us. PV, who served as the Prime Minister of the country during the difficult period, saved the country from the financial crisis and paved the way for modern India with his rule," KTR posted on 'X'. The BRS leader stated that after the formation of Telangana State, the BRS government honoured the beloved son of the state in a befitting manner. KTR recalled that the BRS government celebrated the birth centenary celebrations of Narasimha Rao on a grand scale. "We named Necklace Road as PV Marg, installed the statue of PV and named the Veterinary University after PV," he said. "Not only that. The Telangana government sent a resolution to the Central government to give Bharat Ratna to PV Narasimha Rao. It nominated PV's daughter to the Legislative Council."

He emphasized that the TDP does not believe in acting out of vengeance, stating, "If we were intent on revenge, the entire family of Perni Nani, involved in the scam, would have been sent to jail." Continuing his attack, Ravindra alleged that Perni Nani is in a dire position, unable to provide an explanation regarding the diverted rice. He ridiculed the YSRCP leader, saying, "If you are not guilty, why are you running around like a thief avoiding capture?"

CM Chandrababu Implements Advanced Technology for Security Around His Residence

At Chandrababu's residence in Undavalli, cutting-edge drones have been deployed to monitor the surrounding areas. These drones are programmed to take flight every two hours, meticulously surveying the vicinity and capturing visual data. Any unusual activity, such as suspicious movements or objects, is promptly flagged, and an alert is sent to the monitoring team. The data collected by the drones is ana-

lyzed by police officials to ensure the area around the Chief Minister's residence remains secure. By leveraging technology, authorities have managed to maintain robust security with a reduced number of personnel. Chandrababu has also instructed that traffic disruptions during his travel should be minimized. He personally monitors the implementation of these instructions, inquiring with officials whenever prolonged

traffic halts are observed during his movements. Former SC judge V Ramasubramanian appointed NHRC chairperson

Under the Protection of Human Rights (PHR) Act, 1993, the apex human rights body consists of a Chairperson, five full-time members and seven deemed members. NHRC has been waiting for a full-time Chairperson since June 1, after former Supreme Court judge and the eighth Chairman of the rights panel, Justice Arun Mishra, retired on completion of his tenure in office. Since then, the NHRC has been functioning with just one member in five positions, Vijaya Bharathi Sayani, also the Acting Chairperson. As per Sections 2, 3 and 4 of the PHR Act, the Chairman and other members are appointed by the President upon the recommendation of a committee consisting of the Prime Minister (who serves as the committee's Chairperson), Home Minister, Leaders of the Opposition in both Houses of the Parliament, the Speaker of Lok Sabha and the Deputy Chairman of Rajya Sabha. The qualification of the NHRC Chairperson is that he should either have been a Chief Justice of India or a judge of the Supreme Court. Besides Chairperson, NHRC consists of five other members other than the ex-officio members. One member is, or has been a judge of the apex court and one member is, or has been the Chief Justice of a High

Court. Out of the remaining three members selected for their professional experience in matters centred on human rights, at least one must be a woman. The ex-officio members include the Chairpersons of National Commissions — National Commission for Scheduled Castes, National Commission for Scheduled Tribes, National Commission for Women, National Commission for Minorities, National Commission for Backward Classes, National Commission for Protection of Child Rights; as well as the Chief Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities. The sitting Judge of the Supreme Court or sitting Chief Justice of any High Court can be appointed to the post only after consultation with the Chief Justice of India. The tenure of the NHRC Chairman is five years or until the Chairman turns 70 years — whichever is earlier. The statutory body of NHRC came into being on October 12, 1993, under the Protection of Human Rights Ordinance of September 28, 1993. The NHRC is entrusted with the protection and promotion of human rights, which the Act defines as "rights relating to life, liberty, equality and dignity of the individual guaranteed by the Constitution or embodied in the International Covenants and enforceable by courts in India."
